### **Read 2 Peter 3:1-7**

What picture does Peter give of unbelievers – both now and in the future? Do you think about your unbelieving friends/family this way? What might change for you if you did?

### **Read Revelation 4:11; Romans 3:9-12; 1 Peter 3:18; John 3:36**

How do each of these verses reflect an essential part of the gospel message, or our response to it? What would be missing if we left any of these parts out?

### **Think about the non-christian friend or family member you identified after the sermon on Sunday...**

... whether you texted them or not, spend some time sharing about why they're on your heart. Then pray as a group for the conversation you plan to have.

If you've found it difficult to work up the courage to get in touch, here are some suggested ways of opening the conversation:

- “As you know, I’m a Christian. Would you ever consider checking out the Christian message for yourself?”
- “The most famous verse in the Bible is John 3:16. Has anyone ever explained to you what it means?”
- “I’ve been reflecting on what I believe about God recently, and I’d love to run a few thoughts by you.”
- “I can explain the Christian message to you using drawings in just a few minutes. Have you got time for a coffee?” *(Use two ways to live)*
